## Winterizing the Vac-Alert™ System

 Remove the Vac- Alert<sup>™</sup> SVRS at the union, bottom side. Take care not to misplace the O-ring that is on the underside of the unit.





 Install a #8 standard rubber winter plug in the opening where the Vac- Alert<sup>™</sup> SVRS was located.



3) Blow out the lines with air per normal procedure (consult your pool service provider).

- 4) After the Vac- Alert™ SVRS is removed, drain any water remaining in the unit prior to storage. To drain the unit:
  - · remove the vent screen



 depress the piston once the piston is depressed, any residual water in the unit will drain out.



After draining, the piston should be reset and the vent screen re-installed prior to storage.

- 5) Store the Vac- Alert<sup>™</sup> SVRS in the original box, or in a way that it is protected and the O-ring is not lost.
- 6) Be sure to advise the end user that the Vac- Alert<sup>™</sup> SVRS must be installed and tested prior to re-opening the pool/spa.

NOTE: Winterize the pool/spa as per your pool service provider's recommendations (e.g., antifreeze, etc.), for your climate zone.
